% of eligible children served- Per 2022 factbook, there are approximately 284 low income 4 year old children in the city of Cranston. Of those 284, 74 were enrolled in Head Start, approximately 26%. The number of eligible infants and toddlers is higher, and the number of Early Head Start slots is lower, indicating approximately 3% of eligible children are served.


Enrolled Children who received Medical exam:

PARENT ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

Librarians from our local library came to each site to read to our children and families! They also were there to help families fill out library card applications so that all children would have access to books!

Our health fair was a huge success with over 20 local vendors! There were performances by local Karate and Dance Studios, along with facepainting and an obstacle course. Our police and fire departments were present, along with many of the other CCAP programs available for families. The parents were able to get valuable resources, all related to health and safety!

TRANSITION TO K INFORMATION

We had over 50 families join us for our Transition to K Event. The Cranston School Department attended, and families were able to meet teachers and principles and ask questions about a typical kindergarten day and what to expect. The children all sat together by elementary school so they were able to see who they would be going to school with in the fall!


SCHOOL READINESS

Brightstars: In May, our Broad Street location applied for and received a 4-star rating. The RI Association for the Education of Young Children had suspended their quality ratings of childcare programs during the pandemic and resumed in 2022 for programs who were new and needing a rating.



CLASS: CLASS is a classroom rating tool used to define quality in the classroom based on interactions. The focus is on high quality interactions that help to develop children's critical thinking skills. The quality of interactions are the strongest predictors of a child's learning. The Office of Head Start utilizes the CLASS tool to determine quality programming and low CLASS scores across a program can lead to potential Designation Renewal.

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Data collected each checkpoint indicated that children made gains from Fall to Spring in 22 different dimensions. We attribute the progression of the children's' skills to the quality staff, ongoing professional development, coaching, and family participation. Our program utilizes the TSG assessment at three checkpoints during the academic year. The following is the TSG data collected at the first and last checkpoints.
